PROPOSALS IN RELATION TO RE-ELECTION OF DIRECTORS, GENERAL MANDATES TO ISSUE AND REPURCHASE SHARES AND NOTICE OF ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING

INTRODUCTION

The purpose of this circular is to provide you with the 2012 AGM Notice and the information regarding the resolutions to be proposed at the 2012 AGM relating to (i) the re-election of Directors who are going to retire and offer themselves for re-election at the 2012 AGM; and (ii) the grant to the Directors of general mandates to issue and repurchase Shares and the extension of the general mandate to issue additional Shares to include Shares to be purchased or repurchased.

RE-ELECTION OF DIRECTORS

Pursuant to article 116, at each AGM one-third of the Directors for the time being (excluding any Directors who may be required to retire at the same AGM under other provisions of the Articles), or if their number is not three or a multiple of three, then the number nearest to but not less than one-third, shall retire from office by rotation provided that every Director shall be subject to retirement by rotation at least once every three years. Article 116 also requires that the Directors to retire in every year shall be those who have been longest in office since their appointment or last election but as between persons who became Directors on the same day those to retire shall (unless they otherwise agree between themselves) be determined by lot. In addition, code provision A.4.2 of the CG Code provides, inter alia, that every Director should be subject to retirement by rotation at least once every three years.

The Company shall issue an announcement and/or a supplementary circular, if applicable, to inform the Shareholders the biographical details of the additional candidate proposed if a valid notice in accordance with article 120 from any Shareholder to propose a person to stand for election as a Director at the 2012 AGM is received.

GENERAL MANDATES TO ISSUE AND REPURCHASE SHARES

At the last AGM held on 8 September 2011, general mandates were given to the Directors to exercise the powers of the Company to issue and repurchase Shares. These general mandates will lapse upon the conclusion of the 2012 AGM and therefore, ordinary resolutions will be proposed at the 2012 AGM to grant the general mandates as follows:

- (a) to grant to the Directors a general and unconditional mandate to allot, issue, grant, distribute and otherwise deal with additional Shares not exceeding twenty per cent (20%) of the aggregate nominal amount of the share capital of the Company in issue at the date of the passing of the relevant resolution (the "Issue Mandate");

Director's remuneration and term of office

Mr CHEUNG was not appointed for a specific term or any proposed length of services and his directorship is subject to retirement by rotation and re-election at the 2012 AGM in accordance with article 99 and code provision of A.4.2 of the CG Code.

The total remuneration paid to Mr CHEUNG for the year ended 31 March 2012 amounted to HK\$300,000 which was determined with reference to the prevailing market situation, his duties and responsibilities in the Company.

In relation to the re-election of Mr CHEUNG as an independent non-executive director, save as disclosed above, there is no information which is discloseable nor is/was he involved in any of the matters required to be disclosed pursuant to any of the requirements of the provisions under paragraphs 13.51(2)(h) to 13.51(2)(v) of the Listing Rules, and there is no other matter concerning Mr CHEUNG that needs to be brought to the attention of the Shareholders.

6. Dr QIN Xiao PhD Econ. (Aged 65)

Positions held and length of service

Dr QIN was appointed independent non-executive director of the Company in July 2009. He is also a member of both the remuneration committee and the nomination committee (newly formed in late March 2012) of the Company.

Experience

Dr QIN is an independent non-executive director of China Telecom Corporation Limited, which is listed on the New York Stock Exchange and dual listed on the Stock Exchange. He was appointed an independent non-executive director of AIA Group Limited in late September 2010 which securities were listed on the Stock Exchange in late October 2010. Dr QIN was also appointed as a non-executive chairman of Amex Resources Limited on 2 April 2012 which is listed on the Australian Securities Exchange. He retired as the chairman of China Merchants Group in August 2010 and ceased as the chairman and non-executive director of China Merchants Bank Company Ltd., which is listed on the Stock Exchange and dual listed on the Shanghai Stock Exchange, in September 2010.

Based on the information available to the Board, and by reference to the rule 3.13 of the Listing Rules which sets out certain criteria on independence of the independent non-executive directors, the Board considers that Dr QIN is independent. Further, in the view of the extensive knowledge and experience of Dr QIN, the Board believes that his re-election is in the best interests of the Company and the Shareholders as a whole.

Relationships with directors, senior management, substantial or controlling shareholders of the Company

Dr QIN is not related to any directors, senior management, substantial or controlling shareholders of the Company.

Interests in Shares

As at the Latest Practicable Date, Dr QIN did not have any interests in the Ordinary Shares within the meaning of Part XV of the SFO.

Director's remuneration and term of office

Dr QIN was not appointed for a specific term or any proposed length of services and his directorship is subject to retirement by rotation and re-election at the AGMs at least once every three years in accordance with article 116 and code provision of A.4.2 of the CG Code.

The total remuneration paid to Dr QIN for the year ended 31 March 2012 amounted to HK\$300,000 which was determined with reference to the prevailing market situation, his duties and responsibilities in the Company.

In relation to the re-election of Dr QIN as an independent non-executive director, save as disclosed above, there is no information which is discloseable nor is/was he involved in any of the matters required to be disclosed pursuant to any of the requirements of the provisions under paragraphs 13.51(2)(h) to 13.51(2)(v) of the Listing Rules, and there is no other matter concerning Dr QIN that needs to be brought to the attention of the Shareholders.

This appendix serves as an explanatory statement, as required under the Listing Rules, to provide Shareholders with requisite information reasonably necessary for them to make an informed decision as to whether to vote for or against the ordinary resolution to be proposed at the 2012 AGM in connection with the Repurchase Mandate.

1. SHARE CAPITAL

As at the Latest Practicable Date, the issued share capital of the Company was HK\$337,568,591.75 divided into 1,350,274,367 fully paid Ordinary Shares.

Subject to the passing of the ordinary resolution numbered 5 set out in the 2012 AGM Notice for approving the Repurchase Mandate and on the basis that no further Shares will be issued or repurchased prior to the 2012 AGM, the Company would be allowed under the Repurchase Mandate to repurchase Shares up to a maximum of 135,027,436 Shares during the period in which the Repurchase Mandate remains in force.

2. REASONS FOR REPURCHASES

The Directors believe that the proposed grant of the Repurchase Mandate is in the interests of the Company and the Shareholders as a whole. The Repurchase Mandate will give the Company the flexibility to repurchase Shares as and when the Company deems appropriate. Such repurchases may, depending on market conditions and funding arrangements at that time, lead to an enhancement of the net assets and/or earnings per share or may otherwise be in the interests of the Company. The Directors will decide on the number of Shares to be repurchased on each occasion and the price and other terms upon which the same is repurchased at the relevant time having regard to the circumstances then pertaining and they will do so only when they believe that such repurchases will benefit the Company and the Shareholders. At present, the Directors have no intention to repurchase any Shares.

3. FUNDING OF REPURCHASES

In repurchasing the Shares, the Company may only apply funds legally available for such purpose in accordance with its M&A and the laws of the Cayman Islands.

The Company is empowered by its M&A to repurchase Shares. M&A and the applicable laws of the Cayman Islands provide that, subject to solvency, the purchase price of the Shares may be paid out of the profits available for distribution, the Company's capital and share premium account.

The Directors do not propose to exercise the Repurchase Mandate to such an extent as would, in the circumstances, have a material adverse effect on the working capital or the gearing position of the Company which in the opinion of the Directors is from time to time appropriate for the Company. However, based on the audited consolidated financial statements for the year ended 31 March 2012 of the Company (being the date to which the latest published consolidated financial statements of the Company were made up), there might be a material adverse impact on the working capital or gearing position of the Company in the event that the Repurchase Mandate is exercised in full.

4. UNDERTAKING

None of the Directors nor, to the best of their knowledge having made all reasonable enquiries, any of their associates (as defined in the Listing Rules) has any present intention to sell any Shares to the Company in the event that the Repurchase Mandate is approved by the Shareholders.

The Board has undertaken to the Stock Exchange that, so far as the same be applicable, it will exercise the powers of the Company to make repurchases pursuant to the Repurchase Mandate in accordance with the Listing Rules, M&A and the applicable laws of the Cayman Islands.

No connected persons (as defined in the Listing Rules) have notified the Company that they have a present intention to sell Shares to the Company, or have undertaken not to do so, in the event that the Repurchase Mandate is approved by the Shareholders.

5. EFFECT OF THE TAKEOVERS CODE

If, as a result of a repurchase of Shares, a Shareholder's proportionate interest in the voting rights of the Company increases, such increase will be treated as an acquisition for the purpose of rule 32 of the Takeovers Code. Accordingly, a Shareholder, or a group of Shareholders acting in concert (within the meaning of the Takeovers Code), could obtain or consolidate control of the Company and become obliged to make a mandatory offer in accordance with rule 26 of the Takeovers Code.

For the purpose of the Takeovers Code, CCM Trust (Cayman) Limited and LBJ Regents Limited (both being substantial shareholders of the Company within the meaning of the SFO) and Mr CHA Mou Sing Payson, Mr CHA Mou Zing Victor, Mr CHA Mou Daid Johnson, Mr CHA Yiu Chung Benjamin and Ms WONG CHA May Lung Madeline (all being Directors and discretionary beneficiaries of certain trusts relating to Ordinary Shares held directly and/or indirectly by the abovementioned substantial shareholders), are taken as parties acting in concert and collectively treated as a single controlling shareholder of the Company under the term "Cha Family". As at the Latest Practicable Date, the Cha Family together had an aggregate interest in 673,149,146 Ordinary Shares, representing approximately 49.85% of the issued share capital of the Company. Among them, 560,153,905 Ordinary Shares were held by CCM Trust (Cayman) Limited, 106,137,275 Ordinary Shares were held by LBJ Regents Limited, 5,737,713 Ordinary Shares were held as personal and corporate interests by Mr CHA Mou Sing Payson and 1,120,253 Ordinary Shares were held as personal interests by Mr CHA Mou Zing Victor. In the event that the Directors exercise in full the powers to repurchase Shares pursuant to the Repurchase Mandate, then (if the present shareholdings otherwise remained the same) the aggregate attributable shareholdings of the said parties would increase to approximately 55.39% of the issued share capital of the Company. In the opinion of the Directors, such increase would give rise to an obligation for the Cha Family to make a mandatory offer under rule 26 of the Takeovers Code.
